MacIntyre School is a truly special place, providing excellent education and care for children and young people aged between 10 and 19 with autism, severe learning difficulties and complex needs.

We have the highest expectations for our children and want them to achieve more than anyone ever thought possible. Positive, respectful relationships are at the core of all of our interactions with the children, each other, parents and families and everyone we come into contact with.

The school reflects the DNA of the whole charity and you will see these values in action when you visit us. They are a key reason why this is such a special place for our young people to live and most importantly continue their educational journey.

Developing each child and young person's interest and engagement in learning is fundamental to our approach. We promote independence and effective communication in everything that we do. Across the school and children's homes we have a 'team around the child' approach with everyone working together to meet each child's very specific needs. We have a strong focus on the individual, providing personalised learning based on approaches and strategies such as TEACCH, PECS and Intensive Interaction.

We are committed to working with you to provide the best education and care for your child now and to promote the best opportunities for them in the future. We provide consistency of approach for our students, so that learning takes place throughout the waking day and in all environments: in school, in houses, in the community and at home.

You can be assured that your child will have a comprehensive educational programme that is tailored to their needs and many opportunities enabling them to explore their interests and develop new ones. We offer a vibrant programme of out of school activities that include a youth club, drama club, film night and exciting trips out to local theme parks, bowling alleys and wildlife parks. We are also a licenced centre for the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

We adopt a truly flexible approach to our young people and meeting their needs. Our residential setting operates for 52 weeks a year, the school is open for 40 weeks and can offer either a day placement, full time or flexible residential placements. Our school and children's homes are purpose-built and situated in Wingrave, a beautiful and picturesque village in Buckinghamshire. We also have a children's home in nearby Leighton Buzzard and the students travel daily to the school.



The school has many facilities and resources including a sensory room, multi-sensory pool, climbing wall, multi-use surface basketball court and trim trail. We would welcome you to visit our school, meet our staff and students and experience what we can offer.

Education

Personalisation is at the core of the education we provide. We pride ourselves on delivering stimulating, highly effective learning in a caring, sensitive and creative environment, centred on the individual needs of each child.

Our knowledgeable and experienced staff make use of a wide range of strategies to best meet individual learning preferences, including autism specific approaches designed to reduce anxieties and support students to overcome barriers to learning, enabling them to achieve beyond whatever may have felt possible. Exciting activities are designed to engage students in learning to and support them in developing new skills through a challenging, vibrant curriculum. The education, residential and health and therapy teams work collaboratively to deliver a consistent approach to each student.

Child Centred

We have a team of health professionals and specialists who support all of the children at MacIntyre School. The team works closely together with staff, families and other professionals to ensure holistic assessments, well-planned and co-ordinated interventions and thorough evaluations of progress are carried out.

This holistic way of teaching and supporting our children and young people compliments our Child Centred Approach as it ensures that the student is always at the centre of everything we do and that every child and young person has their mental, physical, emotional health and; their sensory processing needs; independent skills and communication needs all identified and met to ensure the continued progression of their learning in a 'team around the child' approach.

Our My Way Co-ordinator works with our older students and their families to help identify the best possible learning and life opportunities when it is time to leave MacIntyre School. Her role is to ensure that our young people have excellent transition into the adult world and the next phase of their learning and life.


Residential Provision

Our residential provision comprises of four modern houses, registered as one children's home within the school campus, adjacent to the heart of the village of Wingrave. Each house accommodates between three to five students in their own single-occupancy room, decorated and equipped to their individual tastes.

We have a further registered children's home, Hillside Road, which is located in the nearby town of Leighton Buzzard, approximately six miles from the school. This is a detached house in a residential area, with en-suite facilities and a large garden. Hillside can accommodate up to five children, who also attend the school.

Residential staff teams work with Learning Support Assistants and members of the Therapy team to ensure opportunities are given for continued learning and skill development at all times of day.


