The first thing we were shown was a weighing machine where all the waste from Milton Keynes green bins gets taken to be weighed and turned into compost after boiling. We saw lots of French mix breed bullocks. They were very friendly and eating lots of hay and were all different colours. We went into the sheep barn and saw lots of pregnant sheep in pens.







We saw one sheep in labour trying to push the lamb out. We saw the legs came out first and after a few minutes the rest of the lamb was born. The lamb was tiny and its mum licked him clean. The lamb's legs were wobbly but it managed to stand up after a little while and walk around. The sheep started crouching down and pushing again and another baby lamb was born.

My trip to The Manchester Christmas Market (Continued)




I went to different parts of the market and to parts of Manchester and I saw the fountains and reindeer.

Our trip to Euro Disney By Louise, Simon and Peter in Flitwick










The caves were used for lots of different things like sleeping in, storing grain and making things from leather. The caves were used as an air raid shelter during World War two.

Banana and Honey Teabread by Rosie Joustra in Milton Keynes

What you need

225g Self Raising flour

100g Caster sugar

1/4 Teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg

100g of Butter

3 Bananas

2 Large eggs

Grated rind of 1 lemon

6 Tablespoons thick honey

What you need to do

Preheat the oven to 180C



Lightly grease a loaf tin with butter



Mash the bananas



Rub the flour, nutmeg and butter until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs



Add the bananas, eggs to the flour Mixture and mix together





Banana and Honey Teabread (continued)

What you need to do



Pour into your tin and it's now ready to go in the oven



Bake in a preheated oven for 1 and $\frac{1}{4}$ hours



Leave to cool



This is an eight slice loaf

Be nice and do a good deed.








