






A Village Day Out (continued)


The car ride was really relaxing, but I got really excited when I saw the Drayton Manor sign.

Derby County Football Club is coming to have some sessions with us soon, we can't wait.
















Our Day of Tennis by Paul and Laurence in Leicestershire

- 3. James Ward (Great Britain) vs. Tobias Simon (Germany)














Our Day of Tennis (continued)

ordinary bowling balls.






My staff Kirsty and Wes applied to the Staff Council and we got the money.



Jumanji 3 Film Review by Simon in Shropshire








Supa Speedy Fitness Lunchbox Pasta | By Sharon in Milton Keynes

What to do

- Boil the fusilli pasta in a saucepan for 6 to 7 minutes until soft.
- 2. Boil an egg in a saucepan for 4 to 5 minutes until it's hard boiled and drain off the water and set aside.
- 3. Drain the pasta and add back into the saucepan.
- 4. Chop up the onions into small pieces and add to the pasta.
- 5. Chop the egg up into small pieces.
- 6. Add the three big spoonfuls of tomato and basil paste from the jar to the pasta.
- 7. Cut an orange in half and squeeze the juice of half the orange in the pasta.
- 8. Mix everything together in with the pasta with a wooden spoon.
- 9. Serve in your lunchbox to eat at lunchtime.

Makes 2 lunches or serves 2.


