


Co-Production And Working Together By Sui-Ling





Everyone participated in the celebrations in whatever way worked for them and we all had a wonderful weekend.












My Dreams By John Lovett From Shrewsbury

Making Love Rocks In Milton Keynes




The Kindness Rocks project is when people paint pebbles and leave them for others to collect. People share photos of the rocks on Facebook groups and it is a new trend.




